Türkiye has a strong economy and a member of various organizations including OECD, WTO, Council of Europe, OSCE, BSEC and G20.

The young and energetic population of Türkiye creates a dynamic ICT sector. The ICT market of Türkiye is growing steadily every year. As of end of 2021, there are 12,3 million fixed subscribers and 86,3 million mobile subscribers. The total number of broadband internet subscribers reached 88,2 million by the end of 2021.

Türkiye's strong economy, young and qualified population, and dynamic and agile ICT sector creates the huge potential for bright and innovative solutions for emerging challenges.

Additionally, National CERT of Türkiye (TR-CERT), which operates within ICTA-BTK, organizes and supports training courses, summer camps, and competitions for awareness raising about cyber security, and trust and confidence in the use of ICTs.

STRONGER TOGETHER

The coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak has highlighted the vital importance of the resilient, reliable and sustainable ICT networks and services. Increased remote working, online education and e-commerce demand tested countries in terms of capacity and reliability of their networks and services. Türkiye was among the countries who responded the pandemic fast, timely and adequately. All necessary measures for business continuity and for maintaining the quality and security of the ICT services were taken rapidly.

Türkiye attaches great importance to developing up to date methods of combating cybercrime and to carry out preventive, deterrent and effective studies. As a result of the continuous efforts in this field, Türkiye was ranked 6th in Europe and 11th in the world at 2020 Global Cybersecurity Index-GCI. As part of Türkiye's long-standing efforts for building confidence and trust in the use of ICTs, Child Online Protection-COP Guidelines of the ITU were translated into Turkish and made available for all stakeholders in 2021.

Cyber threats and harmful online content are joint concerns of all countries. Türkiye believes that international cooperation and information sharing is essential in the fight against cybercrime and for protection of the children at online environment. We are stronger together!

TÜRKİYE'S PROUD HISTORY IN THE ITU

Türkiye is a founder member of the ITU and Council member representing Region B- Western Europe for five consecutive terms since 2002. As an active member of the ITU since 1865, Türkiye has actively participated in and contributed to the work of the Union. Türkiye is not only an active member state of the ITU Council, which it chaired in 2012, also very active in all sectors of the ITU. Representatives of Türkiye have several managerial and rapporteur level responsibilities at ITU study groups of all sectors. Türkiye also actively contributes to the regional preparations for major ITU events within CEPT, the regional telecommunications organisation of European region.

As a reflection of its commitment to the ITU, Türkiye had the honour of hosting three major ITU Conferences: WRC-2000 in İstanbul (the first-ever WRC held in a venue other than Geneva), WTDC-02 in Istanbul and PP-06 in Antalya, as well as several other ITU meetings.
