WHAT DID WE ACHIEVE



Poland joined the ITU in 1921 and has been a reliable member of the ITU Council since 2010.

- During the last three terms in the ITU Council, Poland hosted many high-level gatherings and summits, such as the Global Symposium for Regulators and - recently - IGF 2021.
- Moreover, Poland organised regional conferences and international events for telecommunication and ICT organisations and institutions, e.g. the Regional Development Forum for Europe, the ITU Region C Meeting, ITU Regional Forum for Europe: 5G Strategies, Policies and Implementation, Broadband Competence Office etc.
- Poland is an active contributing partner of the WSIS
 Process and shares its know-how regarding the digital approach to industry, market, education, e-health, and e-administration.
- Poland contributes to the discussion on electromagnetic fields (EMFs), the combating of fake news in this area, and on the roll-out of 5G. Our annual "International conference on 5G, EMF and human health" is the only event of this kind in Europe. Poland has also contributed to the ITU framework in the area of the mapping of infrastructure and the development of broadband networks, citizen-friendly e-administration, and digital education.
