
Context

- The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) depends on assessed contributions to provide adequate and stable funding to carry out vital spectrum and satellite coordination functions, develop technical standards and provide services to its members.
- Revenue comes mainly from two principal sources:
 - Assessed contributions (77%) paid annually by Member States, Sector Members, Associates and Academia.
 - Cost-recovery activities (23%), mainly consisting of sales of publications; projects implementation and satellite network filings.




Class of Contribution Scale

- At PP-22 Member States will announce their final choice of contributory units for the next financial plan (2024/2027) according to the scale defined by the ITU Convention (Art.33)
 - The proposed amount of the Contributory Unit is 318,000 CHF



In steps of one unit




1 1/2 unit class




Milestones for the choice of Contributory Units
